



- 1. Influential Champion
- 2. Adequate Funding
- 3. Sense of Urgency

Collective Impact



- Centralized Infrastructure (backbone)
- Dedicated Staff (backbone)
- Structured Process

Common Agenda



Shared vision for change including common understanding of problem and joint approach to solving through agreed upon actions

Shared Measurement System



Collecting data and measuring results consistently across all organizations

Hold each other accountable

Mutually Reinforcing Activities



Activities differentiated while being coordinated through a mutually reinforcing plan of action

Continuous Communication



Consistent, open communication across all players

Backbone Support



Creating and managing CI requires independent staff who plan, manage, facilitate, and support the initiative

<u>Isolated Impact vs. Collective Impact</u>



Isolated Impact

- Funders select individual grantees who offer most promising solutions
- •Nonprofits work separately, compete to produce independent impact
- Evaluation is by organization
- Large scale change is assumed to depend on scaling
- Corp. & Govt sectors discounted by funders, nonprofits

Collective Impact

- •Funders understand social problems & solutions arise from interactions of many Partners are whoever can play a role
- •Progress depends on working toward same goal & measuring same thing
- Impact depends on increasing cross sector alignment & learning together

Corp. & Govt sectors essential

- Orgs actively coordinate actions & share learnings
